You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

1. What is this product?

Type

Objectives (Terms that appear in bold in this section are described in more detail in the table(s) below.) The product is designed to provide a return in the form of a cash payment on termination of the product. The timing and amount of this payment will depend on the change in value of the **preference shares**, which in turn will depend on the performance of the **underlying**. The product has a fixed term and will terminate on the **maturity date**, unless terminated early. If, at maturity, the **underlying** has fallen below the **barrier level**, the product may return less than the **product notional amount** or even zero.

Early termination following an autocall: The product will terminate prior to the maturity date if, on any autocall observation date, the reference level is at or above the relevant autocall barrier level. On any such early termination, you will on the immediately following autocall payment date receive a cash payment equal to the applicable autocall payment. The relevant dates, autocall barrier levels and autocall payments are shown in the table below.

Termination on the maturity date: If the product has not terminated early, on the maturity date, you will receive:

- 1. if the final reference level is at or above the autocall barrier level, a cash payment equal to GBP 1.39; or
- if the final reference level is at or above the barrier level and below the autocall barrier level, a cash payment equal to GBP 1; or
- 3. if the **final reference level** is below the **barrier level**, a cash payment directly linked to the performance of the **underlying**. The cash payment will equal (i) the **product notional amount** multiplied by (ii) (A) the **final reference level** divided by (B) the **strike level**

Investors should note that the payments described above are based on the expected value of the preference shares. Therefore any return you may receive on the product depends directly on the value of the **preference shares**. As such, your return is only indirectly dependent on the **underlying**.

Under the product terms, certain dates specified above and below will be adjusted if the respective date is either not a business day or not a trading day (as applicable). Any adjustments may affect the return, if any, you receive.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the product issuer may terminate the product, as applicable, early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the product and the product issuer. The **preference shares** in turn contain provisions allowing the **preference shares** to be adjusted or terminated early in the case of certain exceptional events, in particular relating to the **underlying**. Any such adjustments or early termination are likely to affect the amount and timing of return you receive under the product, meaning the return (if any) that you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

2. What are the risks and what could I get in return?

The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 6 years. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to sell your product easily or may have to sell at a price that significantly impacts on how much you get back.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 4 out of 7, which is a medium risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

Be aware of currency risk: If the currency of the product is different from the currency of the country in which you live, you will receive payments in a different currency, so the final return you will get will depend on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

3. What happens if the issuer is unable to payout?

4. What are the costs?

5. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 6 years

The product aims to provide you with the return described under "1. What is this product?" above. However, this only applies if the product is held to maturity. It is therefore recommended that the product is held until 3 April 2024 (maturity).

The product does not guarantee the possibility to disinvest other than by selling the product either (1) through the exchange (if the product is listed) or (2) off-exchange, where an offer for such product exists. No fees or penalties will be charged by the issuer for any such transaction, however an execution fee might be chargeable by your broker if applicable. By selling the product before its maturity, you may receive back less than you would have received if you had kept the product until maturity.
